

Language requirements	For exchange students coming to Loughborough for one semester , an English language qualification is not mandatory. However, students must be proficient in English to B2 level in the CEFR. A confirmation from the partner would be sufficient. Students coming for a full year who require a Student Visa must have an IELTS (or equivalent) score of at least 6.5 overall, with no less than 6 in each component. Please check the latest English Language requirements on our website: www.lboro.ac.uk/international/englang
Minimum grades	We trust that the partners will select their best students to join our exchange programme and therefore we don't set minimum grades for application. We don't normally reject any applications but we reserve the right to deny access to certain modules if we believe that the students don't have the necessary background to be successful on their programmes.

Academic information

Modules and workload 30 ECTS per semester	Students must take most of their modules in the School of Business and Economics. Modules are chosen from a list ("Module list for exchange and visiting students") which is normally confirmed in May.
or 60 Loughborough credits	A student at Loughborough takes 60 Loughborough credits per semester, which is equivalent to 30 ECTS credits. We are expecting exchange students to register for the same number of credits as a student registered for a Loughborough degree.
Undergraduate modules are worth 10 or 5 ECTS credits	Learning agreements with over 30 ECTS will be duly rejected.
Postgraduate modules are worth 7.5 ECTS credits	In exceptional circumstances we may register students in a different number of credits. Partners should submit their requests directly to <u>sbe.international@lboro.ac.uk</u> stating the reasons why the student should be taking more modules than the full workload of a Loughborough student. All requests will be looked at on a case-by- case basis.



Module registration	The International Relations Office will register the students in their modules prior to their arrival and inform them of any changes required (due to timetable clashes and/or module availability).		
Module changes after the programme starts	After the programme starts module changes are only possible if the student has timetable conflicts therefore we advise all the students to carefully consider and discuss their modules with their home universities. We kindly advise all the partners to look at the module contents prior to their approval to make sure the students have the background required.

Practical information

Visa	From 1 January 2021 the visa regulations for students studying in the UK have changed.

	 If you need a visa, you should consider the following costs: Around £350 for the visa application fee Around £500 for the immigration Health Surcharge
	The Student Advice and Support Service (SASS) from the University also provides advice to all students who need to apply for Student permission from outside the UK. Health insurance - Students joining us for 1 semester only	 Studying in the UK for less than 6 months Students that come to the UK to study for less than 6 months are not entitled to free healthcare and they cannot register for a GP (family doctor) nor the medical centre on campus. Before you travel, you need to buy travel insurance that comes with healthcare cover. If you are an EU, EEA or Swiss national you will be exempt from some medical costs if you have a European Health Insurance Card (EHIC). It is important that you apply for an EHIC in your own country and bring it with you.
Health insurance - Students joining us for the full year	Studying in the UK for more than 6 months Students that come to the UK to study for less than 6 months are entitled to free healthcare and they can register for a GP (family doctor) including the medical centre on campus. When you apply for a visa, you will be asked to pay the Immigration Health Surcharge (IHS). This costs £470 and will allow you to use most of the NHS services for free. However, services as prescriptions, dental treatment and optical treatment are not included and need to be paid.



Accommodation	Once the application documents have been approved , students will be sent an official acceptance letter that contains their student number. With this number, students can apply for the support of the Student Accommodation Centre to help them find a room.
	There is a wide range of accommodation options for students in Loughborough, on-campus and off-campus.
	Please note that on-campus accommodation is extremely limited.
	There is no guarantee that exchange students will be allocated rooms in Halls of Residence, therefore you must be prepared to live off-campus if required.
	The Student Accommodation Centre will always help students to secure a place to live.
	 The process of offering students a room on-campus usually occurs: In the end of August/beginning of September for semester 1 and Full year students in December and January for semester 2 students
	On-campus accommodation: There are rooms in catered and self-catered university halls of residence, single or shared. The cost of accommodation varies greatly depending on the kind of room. Catered on-campus rooms can cost from around £130 to £180 per week. Self-catered rooms are from around £87 to £170.
	Off-campus accommodation: The Accommodation Office also helps with approved off-campus accommodation. Rooms off-campus can cost around £90 per week, dependent on whether bills are included.
	Private accommodation: There is an extensive offer of private student halls and shared houses in Loughborough. If you decide to find a place on your own, please discuss it with us, as we might be able to give you some useful tips.
	Loughborough University can accommodate students with specific requirements (e.g. cultural, dietary, medical and religious).

Cost of living	By UK standards Loughborough is not an expensive place to live. Your living costs will vary depending upon your lifestyle and choice of accommodation, but we have estimated that you will need around £9,000 a year to cover accommodation and all major living expenses, including food, clothing, books and local travel.
