STUDY DETAILS

COURSES

Students must attend the UW on a full-time basis. A full-time course load is 12-18 UW credits per guarter, 18 credits is the maximum. Ouarters run for 10 weeks plus 1 week for final exams. Incoming Foster Exchange Students typically take three or four 300- to 400-level business courses with each business course carrying 4 UW credits. Exchange students are responsible for ensuring that the credits they receive will transfer back to their home institution. Demand and space constraints make Finance, Information Systems, and Accounting courses difficult to get into. Foster Incoming Exchange Students are allowed to take non-business coursework if they meet the prerequisites and are granted access by the department.

LEARNING EXPECTATIONS

Class formats include lecture and discussion, in-class presentations and case studies. Attendance in required. Grading is based on papers, group projects, case studies, class participation and exams. Exam formats may vary. Typically exams are held during the final week of the quarter.

LENGTH OF CLASS

A typical 300- or 400-level 4-credit business course runs 2 days per week, for 2 hours per day, for a total of 4 hours of class time each week or 40 hours of class time during a quarter. Courses usually run either Monday and Wednesday, or Tuesday and Thursday anytime from 7:30 a.m. until 9:30 p.m. Courses outside the Foster School operate on different schedules.

NOMINATION PROCESS

Exchange coordinators will be sent a nomination link prior to the nomination period by the UW Foster Inbound Exchange Manager. After submitting a nomination via the online form, both students and exchange coordinators will receive an email with student application instructions.

APPLICATION

Students will create an online account with instructions from the email sent after nomination. They will be asked to upload the following by the student application deadline:

- Copy of passport identification page
- All college transcripts, translated into English
- Proof of English proficiency is required. This can be demonstrated with a minimum TOEFL (iBT) score of 76 (105 or higher recommended), or IELTS score of 6.0 (7.0 or higher recommended) or Duolingo (DET) score of 110 (131 or higher recommended).

Exception: International students whose primary and secondary education took place in Australia, Canada (English-speaking provinces), the United Kingdom, Ireland, New Zealand or the U.S. are exempt from this requirement. Students born in one of these countries and educated elsewhere are still required to satisfy the English proficiency requirement. Letters from home universities are no longer accepted.

REOUIREMENTS

- Be enrolled at a partner school at the 3rd or 4th year level.
- A minimum GPA 3.0/4.0 is required.

LIFE ON CAMPUS

ACCOMMODATIONS

Students have the option of registering for on-campus housing. This is not guaranteed and is assigned on a first come, first serve basis. The cost ranges from \$3000 - \$6000 per quarter. HEALTH INSURANCE

Students are required to have health insurance at the UW. They can provide proof of insurance from their home country or purchase UW student insurance (ISHIP). Cost: \$449/Quarter (2024-2025 rates).
