- 7. Digital File of Passport-Sized Photograph that will be used for Student ID Card and Residence Card (Headshots with Plain Background; 3 x 4)

VISA Procedure

The Certificate of Eligibility (COE) is a necessary document for student visa issuance. WBS will apply for the COE based on the information the student provides. As soon as it is issued, an electronic version of the COE, Certificate of Admission and Letter of Acceptance will be emailed to the student. Upon receipt, students are required to apply for a student visa at the nearest Embassy of Japan or Consulate on his/ her own.

When COEs are expected to be issued:

Programme Information

Courses Available for Exchange Students

Credits and Workload of Courses

Our class structure is 100 minutes per class with a 14-week workload of approximately 23.5 hours, equivalent to 2 credits, including lectures, classes, contact hours, assignments, examinations and independent study.

The WBS does not have a minimum course credit requirement. Exchange students can enroll up to ten WBS courses (20 credits). The designated course list for exchange students will be shared one month before the commencement of each semester.

The course registration will take place online during the registration period. Students are strongly advised to consult with the coordinator(s) at the home institution regarding the academic requirements of his/ her home institution.

Should the number of applicants exceed class capacity, a lottery system will be implemented where students are randomly selected for course enrolment. <u>Living & Personal Expenses</u>

When you submit your application, you must be able to show official proof (bank statements, etc.) that you are able to allocate at least 150,000 Japanese Yen per month as living expenses in Japan. Please note that the costs of living have raised in Japan.
