Finland

Housing

The main student housing organization in the Helsinki region is [HOAS](#) (Foundation for Student Housing in the Helsinki Region). Another student housing organization is [AYY](#) (Aalto University Student Union). Kindly note that AYY does not offer furnished apartments. Student apartments typically consist of 3-5 bedrooms, a shared living room, kitchen and bathroom. The apartments are situated around the Helsinki area and students apply for housing directly through the above mentioned organizations.

Student culture and tutoring

Student Union [AYY](#) and Student Association for Business Students at Aalto [KY](#) organize many leisure time activities such as parties, field trips, sports and cultural activities. For example [KY-SUB](#) typically organizes a trip to Lapland for exchange students every semester. All the incoming students are assigned a tutor - a local student helping the incoming student with practicalities in Finland. Each tutor is tutoring a group of around 10 students. The tutoring service is organized in close cooperation with the Student Association.

Benefits for the students and living expenses

Exchange students are entitled to discounts in transportation and student cafeterias. With the discount, transportation costs around 40€ month (AB-ticket) and a meal in the student cafeteria 3,10€. Students can also join the Student Union AYY to receive more benefits. A rent in student housing in Helsinki costs around 400-600€/month and in the private market starting from 600€/month. Food and daily necessities in the capital region usually cost 200-250€/month.

Volunteering in SLUSH

[SLUSH](#) is an annual event organized during the fall semester, where startups and technology talent meet with international investors. SLUSH started in 2008 as Aalto students’ initiative with 300 participants. Since then it has grown into world’s leading startup event with over 12,000 attendees. Every year there are over 2,000 volunteers helping to make the event happen. For exchange students, volunteering in SLUSH is a great opportunity to learn about the extensive startup scene and get a unique experience.
