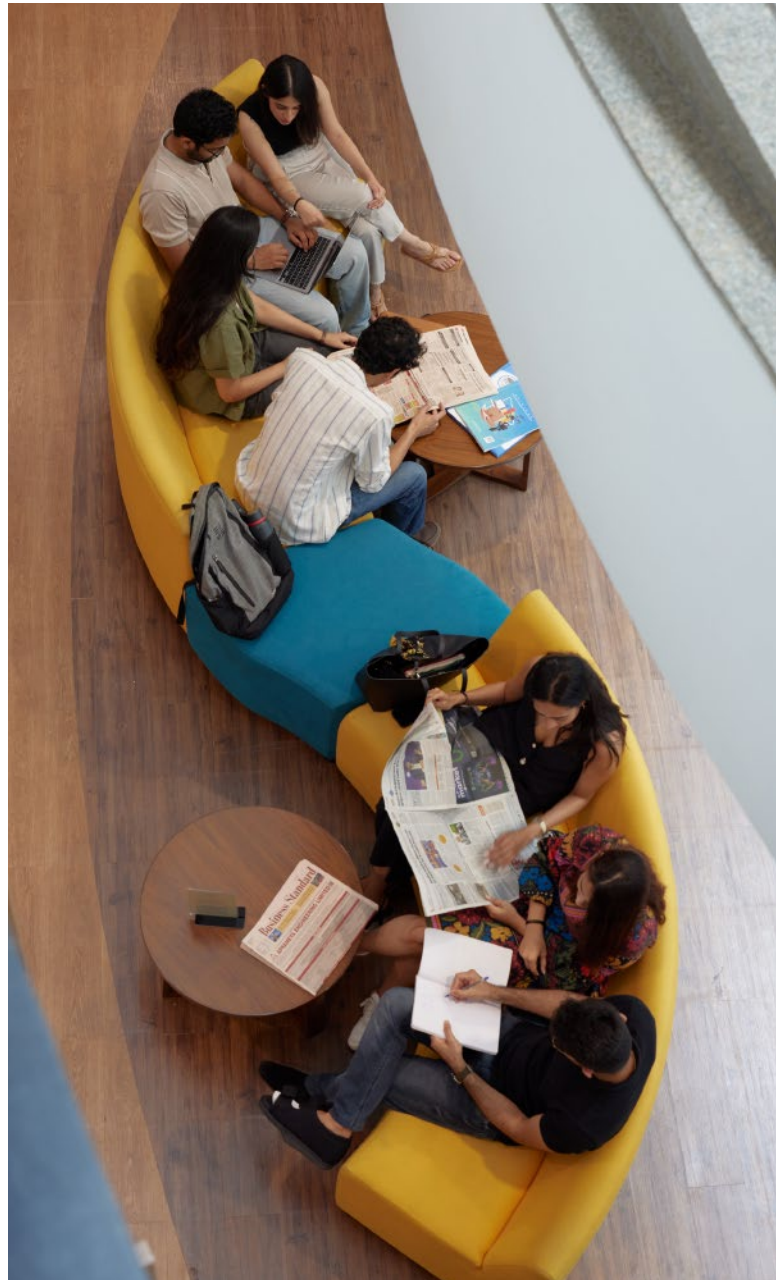

About Hyderabad

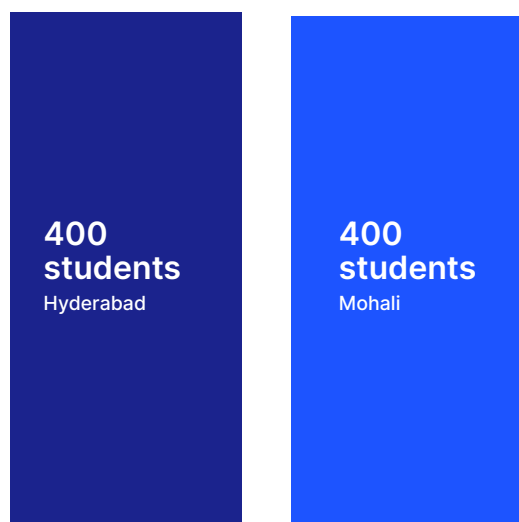

Exchange Programme Expectations

Academic/Experience Requirements

Exchange students are encouraged to complete core courses and have at least two years of professional experience prior to their exchange term. Course-specific prerequisites will be detailed in the syllabus.

Workload

Exchange students can enroll in a minimum of 2 to maximum of 4 or 5 courses per term, each consisting of 10 sessions of two hours, resulting in 20 contact hours per course. Additionally, students have the option to take Block Weeks, which are intensive courses designed to be completed within a week. Each Block Week consists of 5 consecutive days of instruction, with 4 hours per day, amounting to 20 contact hours per one-credit course.

Attendance

ISB mandates 100% attendance. Students must arrive on campus at least two days before the term begins (ideally a week prior) and stay through the term's completion, including exams. Attendance for all sessions of enrolled courses is compulsory, and adherence to International Exchange Office rules is required. Exam schedules are fixed and non-negotiable.

Mode and Language of Instruction

All classes are conducted in-person and in English. Exchange students must demonstrate proficiency in English to actively participate in discussions and coursework.

Required Documents

Incoming exchange students must submit:

- A completed Nomination Form.
- A resume.
- A passport-sized photograph.

Registration Fee

To complete the registration process, exchange students are required to pay a \$100 USD registration fee.

Block weeks are intensive, short-term courses lasting 1 week, with 4-hour sessions each day for 5 days (20 contact hours). Students can enrol in only one course per block week.

It is compulsory for exchange students to reach the campus at least one to two days before the term begins, and they are required to stay on campus till their term ends (including exams).

Facilities and Services

The ISB campus is thoughtfully designed to provide a world-class living and learning experience, featuring:

- **Academic Spaces:** Academic Centre, lecture theatres, and a Learning Resource Centre (library with a computer room).
- **Residential Comforts:** Fully furnished Student Villages with modern amenities, including air conditioning, cable TV, high-speed internet, and electric utilities.
- **Recreational Amenities:** Dining hall, café, swimming pool, and a state-of-the-art recreation centre.
- **Everyday Essentials:** On-campus bank, ATM, Wellness Centre, mail room, bookstore, and convenience store.
- **Additional Services:**
 - a. Housekeeping services in all accommodations.
 - b. Laundry services available at an additional charge.
 - c. Assistance with mobile connections and currency exchange through the exchange coordinator.

Note: Students are required to bring their own towels and toiletries.

Accommodation

On-Campus Accommodation

On-campus accommodation is available but limited. Rooms are allocated on a firstcome, first-served basis.

Off-Campus Accommodation

For students unable to secure on-campus accommodation, the Exchange Office will assist in finding convenient, serviced apartments near the school to ensure a comfortable stay.

Expenses

Academic Expenses

- Course Materials: All course materials are provided, while textbooks can be purchased at the on-campus bookstore.

Living Expenses

- Shared Accommodation: INR 29,250 per term (taxes as applicable), approximately USD 337 + tax.
- Family Accommodation: INR 64,500 per term (taxes as applicable), approximately USD 743 + tax. (Limited availability.)
- Students can move into on-campus accommodation 1-2 days before the term begins. For earlier arrivals, students should check with the Exchange Coordinator.

Additional Costs

- Electricity charges are based on usage.
- Laundry services are available at applicable rates.

Other Expenses

- **Travel:** Students are responsible for travel between Hyderabad and Mohali.
- **Local Transportation:** Personal city travel expenses are self-managed. Cabs cost approximately \$15 USD for half a day.

Health & Safety

Health Insurance

Exchange students must have valid health insurance covering their stay in India. COVID-19 coverage is also strongly recommended. Check for any specific health insurance requirements for the Indian visa application.

Vaccination

All incoming exchange students must be fully vaccinated.

Visa Requirements

Students must obtain a student visa—a tourist visa is not acceptable. ISB will provide a visa recommendation letter to support the application. For two-term exchanges, the visa must cover both campuses.

Foreigners' Regional Registration Office (FRRO)

Students with visas exceeding 180 days or with FRRO registration requirements must register within 14 days of arrival. Citizens of Afghanistan, Bangladesh, and Pakistan must register within 24 hours.

Required Documents for FRRO Registration

- Bonafide certificate and residence proof letter (provided by ISB).
- Original and photocopy of the passport with all visa stamps.
- Soft copy of passport-size photos.
- Yellow Fever certificate (for African nationals).

Alumni Status

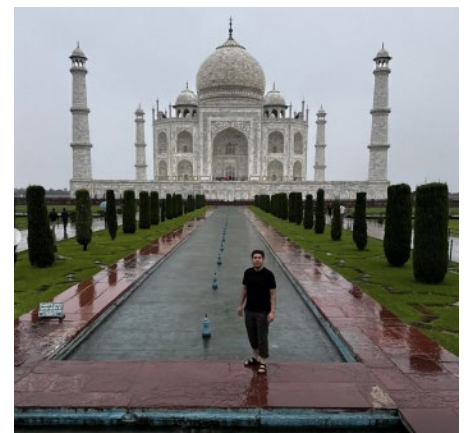
Incoming exchange students are not granted ISB alumni status.
