It's around the Victory Day when I was in Yaroslavl, I was lucky to witness girl scouts marching to the Eternal Flame of Yaroslavl, which signifies the glorious day during the Soviet time. Kostroma is one of the cities along the Volga River. Two and a half hours from Yaroslavl by train.

I went to Ipatievsky Monastery during my 1-day visit. It's a distinctively traditional monastery in Russia. It's required to put on classic Russian folk costume, head kerchief and dress, before going inside.

This city (or I should say this town ^^) is very empty, a huge contrast comparing to Moscow. This is the best feature of the town in my opinion. Wandering around the vegetation and riverside is my favourite part of the visit.





Kazan is where East meets West, Muslim meets Christianity. It is the capital of the Republic of Tatarstan which is mostly populated by Tatar. In Kazan, people of various ethnical backgrounds live in a harmony. Unlike Moscow and Saint Petersburg, mosques are more common than cathedrals in the city. I visited Kazan in Mid-June. This is the absolute best time to visit the city.

From Saint Petersburg to Kazan, I've spent more than 45 hours on trains back and fro (almost 2 whole days!). Nevertheless, I really enjoyed the ride as I've had an unforgettable time with my companion. During my 2-day stay in Kazan, I went on a "bicycle boat" trip on the Kaban Lakes.
