Courses

Brandeis International Business School provides two types of courses: full- semester course and half – semester course (also called module class). Full-semester course is 4 credits, so module one is 2 credits. To be a full-time student (also exchange) you must be enrolled in at least 12 credits and maximum is 20 credits. For exchange, at first, IBS will sent you a letter and ask you to choose classes you want to take. If you are not satisfied with the result, you can change it in the beginning of the semester. School provides a period of time for add and drop classes. The only thing you need to do is get the permission from professors. The process for exchange student to drop and add classes is not the same as formal students. We need to use paper form instead of online system. After filling all information in the form, don't forget to bring them to School Registrar (on upper campus). Latte is the network communication program used for course work related communications. Instructor, students and teaching assistant use this for posting assignment and asking questions. Here's the information about classes:
